What is a jamboree? A quick overview.

The jamboree provides an exceptional opportunity for all attendees to experience a hands-on link with one of the most historic areas of the country. At the same time, it focuses the country's pride and attention on an organization whose youth membership extends Scouting values into the 21st century.

Purpose of the Jamboree:

- Bring youth and leaders to a clear understanding of, a deeper sense of commitment to, the ideals of Scouting
- Build—for those who attend and for those who remain at home—a deep pride in belonging to one of the world's great youth movements.
- Show the citizens of the United States of America and the world a model of democratic action as conducted by a great youth movement in a free society.
- Give youth a rich and genuine Scouting experience of which they can truly say, "This is Scouting at its best!"
- Establish the important need for physical fitness.
- Emphasize the need for conservation of our natural resources in today's world.
- Impress upon the youth of America the need to "Be Prepared" for the challenges of the future.
- Help youth know and love America by learning more about the principles and history of our democracy, by living and sharing with youth from all parts of the nation, and by seeing America en route to and from the Jamboree.
- Provide an opportunity to meet and camp with brother Scouts from many parts of the world.
- Inspire every participant to return to their home, troop chartered organization, and community telling the story of the freedom that is ours and the greatness of the United States of America.

The 2010 Jamboree will have a theme which has not been announced. However it will certainly be centered on the 100th year celebration of Scouting in the United States. It will be the central point culminating months of pre-celebrations of the accomplishments of Scouting in the United States. You should anticipate some exciting arena shows and jamboree activities surrounding this milestone.

The 2010 Circle Ten tour and attendance at the National Scout Jamboree will begin on Wednesday, July 21st with a return on Wednesday, August 4th, 2010. The Jamboree is at Fort A.P. Hill located close to Fredericksburg, Va., just south of Washington, D.C. In previous jamboree trips to this site, the Circle Ten contingent troops have taken a 5 day tour prior to the jamboree. The tour has included time in New York City and Washington, D.C. Details of the jamboree tour and duration are being finalized and will be released soon.

Circle Ten has been allocated 15 troops for the 2010 Jamboree. A Jamboree Troop consists of 36 youth members and 4 adult leaders. This will again be the largest contingent from the Southern region. Space is limited, so apply early and often. With the 100 year celebration of Scouting as the major focus of the jamboree, Circle Ten anticipates the contingent will fill even quicker than prior events. Adult leaders desiring to attend will be required to recruit 9 or more Scouts who submit applications and deposits and be approved by Circle Ten's Jamboree Committee. The tentative fee for the Jamboree and tour is \$2400. This includes all transportation, hotel, meals, patrol and troop gear and jamboree fees. Each participant will be responsible for their personal gear (sleeping bag, etc.) and spending money. The fee will be finalized once final arrangements for airfare have been made with the tour company.

The National Jamboree will use an online application process for all Scouts, leaders and Jamboree staff applicants desiring to attend the jamboree. Applicants will need to use their BSA ID number to access the application website. The website will be activated this June.

The contingent troop leadership will be fully trained in all aspects of this event. Before the Jamboree, troops will be prepared by developing themselves into cohesive teams following the leadership principles and ideals of Scouting. ***Scouting at Its Best for the Next Century***, will be the theme of our contingent and challenge to deliver a truly memorable experience for the Scouts of Circle Ten.

UNIT LEADER QUALIFICATIONS

SCOUTMASTER:

- Be at least 22 years of age by July 1, 2010.
- Serve as Scoutmaster for at least one year during the three-year period prior to July 1, 2010.
- Completed basic *New Leaders Essentials, Scoutmaster Specific, and Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills*.
- Be able to serve as a role model of physical fitness.
- Have participated in the pre-jamboree training experience. (Shakedown camp)
- File a National Scout Jamboree Personal health & Medical Record, Class 3, before the pre-jamboree training.
- Completed the 90-minute *Youth Protection Training*.
- Be approved by the Circle Ten Council and Jamboree Committee.
- Be flexible and a team player
- Have fully paid the council jamboree fee by March 1st, 2010.
- Although not required, *Wood Badge* training and/or *Scouter's Key* are desirable qualifications.

FIRST ASSISTANT SCOUTMASTER:

- Same qualifications as Scoutmaster.

SECOND ASSISTANT SCOUTMASTER:

- Be at least 21 years of age by July 1, 2010.
- Serve actively in an adult troop leadership position for at least one year during the three-year period prior to July 1, 2010.
- Participate in the pre-jamboree training experience. (Shakedown camp)
- File a National Scout Jamboree Personal Health & Medical Record, Class 3, before the pre-jamboree training.
- Complete the 90-minute Youth Protection Training.
- Be flexible and a team player
- Be approved by the local council
- Have fully paid the council jamboree fee by March 1st, 2010.

THIRD ASSISTANT SCOUTMASTER:

- Be at least 18 years of age (but not 21) by August 4, 2010.
- Have served actively in a troop leadership position.
- Participate in the pre-jamboree training experience. (Shakedown camp)
- File a National Scout Jamboree Personal Health & Medical Record, Class 3, before the pre-jamboree training with the Council Jamboree Committee.
- Complete the 90-minute Youth Protection Training.
- Have fully paid the council jamboree fee by March 1st, 2010.
- Be flexible and a team player
- Be approved by the local council
